**Albuquerque, NM (Nov. 21, 2022)**—The Indian Pueblo Kitchen has announced it will be open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. this Thanksgiving Day.

The acclaimed Indigenous restaurant will provide items from its regular menu, along with traditional holiday specials:

- **Rosemary Roasted Turkey** with fresh cranberry sauce, homemade stuffing with turkey gravy, sweet potato with roasted marshmallow, fresh garlic butter green beans, mixed salad with green chile croutons and green chile ranch dressing, hot rolls and butter. \$26.00
- **Pumpkin French Toast:** Pueblo oven bread with cranberry compote, turkey sausage or bacon, choice of egg. \$16.00
- **Roasted Prime Rib**, mashed potato with red chile gravy, fresh garlic butter green beans, mixed salad with green chile croutons and green chile ranch dressing, hot rolls and butter. \$37.00
- **Desserts:** Pumpkin mousse, sweet potato cobbler with ice cream, pecan pie with candied pecans. \$7.00 each.

Reservations are not required; seating is on a first-come, first-served basis. While the Indian Pueblo Kitchen and Indian Pueblo Store will be open, the IPCC facilities, including the museum, will be closed.
