Cooking with Numbers: Traditional Pueblo Dishes

All Grades | \$5 Per Person | 30 Students Max

Students will be utilizing mathematical skills to learn more about the core values of respect, community and service within Pueblo culture. Students will be able to increase their knowledge of mathematics in everyday life and practical application. They will also learn how to make traditional pueblo dishes through a hands-on activity cooking blue corn dishes or Chile tying. This activity aligns to New Mexico State Standards.



Pueblo Emergence Stories & Reciprocity

All Grades | \$5 Per Person | 30 Students Max

Students will be utilizing science skills to explore and observe the beauty and wonderment of life, the earth we live upon and the limited natural resources we must care for. Students will develop appreciation and awareness for the world around them through storytelling of the Pueblo creation. Students will participate in hands-on projects creating constellations. This activity aligns to New Mexico State Standards.

My Culture Helps me

All Grades | \$5 Per Person | 30 Students Max

Students will focus on identifying how family and community collectively build cultural identity. Students will learn how cultural traditions of Pueblo people have been passed down from one generation to the next. Students will participate in an open dialogue explaining how cultural values and traditions from the past impact present time, through a hands-on demonstration of tortilla making. This activity aligns to New Mexico State Standards.



Pueblo Resources & Symbolism

All Grades | \$5 Per Person | 30 Students Max

Students will learn about the natural resources utilized by Pueblo people. Through an additional presentation, they will learn about the symbolism used in pottery and other art forms. Students will describe the connection between culture and land. They will take part in a hands-on activity, where they will be creating their own piece of pottery and design. This activity aligns to New Mexico State Standards.
