INDIAN PUEBLO CULTURAL CENTER HOSTS NATIVE YOUTH HANDS-ON FILM WORKSHOP

IN PARTNERSHIP WITH LENSIC FUTURE VOICES AND BASEMENT FILMS,
WORKSHOP AIMS TO HELP STUDENTS TELL THEIR STORIES THROUGH FILM

Albuquerque, NM (April 6, 2023)—The Indian Pueblo Cultural Center, in partnership with Lentic Future Voices and Basement Films, is hosting a free Native Youth Hands-On Film Workshop on Saturday, April 8 from noon – 4 p.m. at the IPCC campus.

Lentic Future Voices, an educational program of the Lentic Performing Arts Center in Santa Fe, works with students ages 12-18 across New Mexico to tell their stories through original photographs and short films. In collaboration with Santa Fe Workshops, Future Voices is providing Native high school and middle school students with the support they need to create a film using 16mm film and art tools.

Since 1991, Basement Films has been a volunteer-run micro-cinema supporting experimental and under-represented forms of media-making through public screenings, performances, workshops, and lectures. The nonprofit holds an archive of more than 8,000 16mm films from Albuquerque Public Schools, a religious educational films collection, and the South Broadway Cultural Center Collection.
