Albuquerque, NM (Dec. 2, 2022)—The Indian Pueblo Cultural Center Campus invites all to enjoy the spirit of the holiday season during its “Stories by the Fireside” in-person storytelling series, which will be held on Dec. 3, 10, and 17 from 5-7 p.m. each night in the IPCC Courtyard. Doors open at 4:45 p.m.

Each event includes Native American storytellers, each sharing a tale; cultural dances; and complimentary hot chocolate, coffee, and Pueblo cookies.

This Saturday, Dec. 3, IPCC’s very own Andrew Thomas (Diné) and Jon Ghahate (Laguna, Zuni) will be the featured storytellers, and the always-popular White Mountain Apache Crown Dancers will perform.

On Dec. 10, author Laurel Goodluck (Mandan Hidatsa Arikara Nation and Tsimshian tribal member) will be reading from her very first book, *Forever Cousins*. The Howeya Family Traditional Dance Group (Acoma) will perform.

Admission to each event is a coat in good condition or two non-perishable food items, which will be donated to local organizations that support Native American families within our community that are in need this holiday season. The first 20 children (age 12 and under) will receive a door prize. (May be subject to one per family.)
