This exhibition affords the opportunity to see Taos Pueblo

at its finest through the eyes of three talented artists who were born and raised in this community. Taos Pueblo is and has been a thriving Native community, before contact and earlier. Located in Northern New Mexico, the Pueblo is designated as a World Heritage Site for being the longest continually inhabited community.

Through their work, micaceous potter Angie Yazzie, painter Brian Taaffe, and photographer Deborah Lujan represent the resilience and beauty of the Pueblo that exists today. The commonality is clay, mud, the ground, and the strength this holds for them as Red Willow People.

Admission is free through the east entrance.

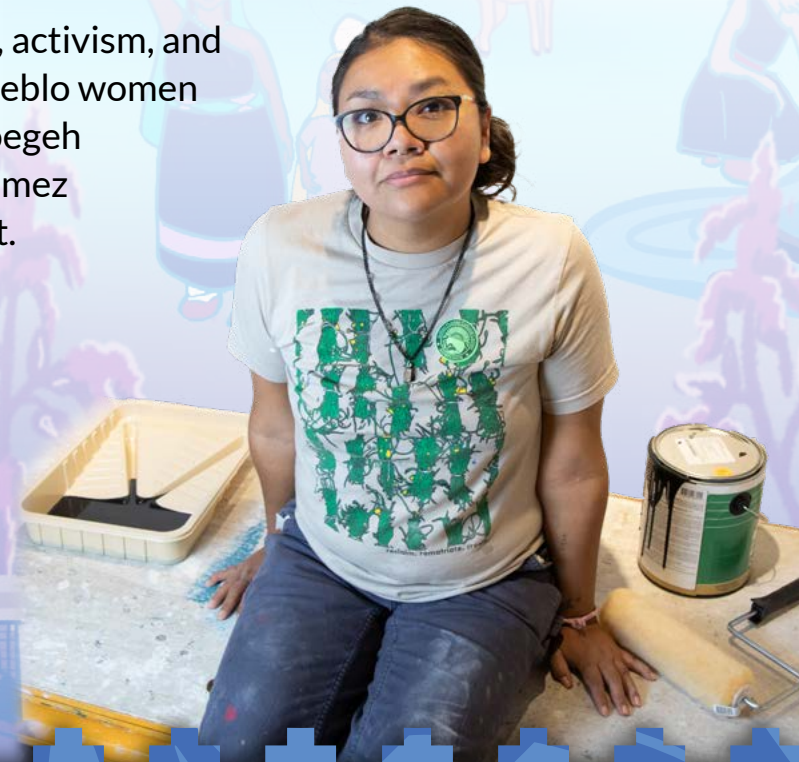
