In 2019, a narrative on the introduction of African slaves into American colonies in 1619 ignited a reawakening—a reexamination of the founding

of the U.S. However, slavery and forced servitude was inflicted upon the Indigenous peoples of the Americas by the Spanish and Portuguese more than a century before the colonization of America. *The Other Slavery: The Uncovered Story of Indian Enslavement in America*, a National Book Award finalist, offers a horrific account of the actions supported by church and crown, of humans denying other humans the right to existence.

Saturday, October 16, 12-1:30pm Artist Circle Gallery Featured Artist Lecture by Wahpah-waagee, Laura Fragua Cota of Jemez Pueblo IPCC Courtyard

Laura displays her thoughts and feelings of her Pueblo Indian lineage and history in her exhibit, *Our Ancestors: Our Historical Strength*. She creates in clay, words, stone, cloth, paint and song to express the world she has seen and lived, "I've heard stories and have danced to the songs that pray for rain. History that we have lived and long to tell will be our strength in the world we live in today. It will be our prayers for ourselves and our world that will carry us all through this time of COVID19 and create a more caring and loving way in our relations with all that the Creator has given us."

Various symbols are added to art works in clay, or textiles and paintings that express these blessings.
