Opening - Pueblo Baseball: Stitching Our Community Together New South Gallery Exhibition Saturday, March 9

This interactive exhibition celebrates the central role that Pueblo Baseball has played and continues to play in many community members' lives at the 19 Pueblos. It tells stories of Pueblo Baseball in looking at the past, present, and future through interviews, photographs, videos, and memorabilia. Critical skills in athletics, judgment, adaptation, and perception as pitchers, batters, runners, catchers, and

umpires are passed down through the generations. Pueblo Baseball games carry on a legacy more than 100+ years old with male team members from 15-55 years old playing together at once.

In creating a space for Pueblo communities to be in dialogue with each other about this century-old tradition, the exhibition serves as an introduction to the ways that Pueblo Baseball shapes Pueblo identities and reflects Pueblo value systems to all audiences. A Community Scrapbook Board will facilitate a space where Pueblo community members can contribute their stories and photographs. During the run of the exhibition, the IPCC will be offering a Baseball Card making activity to school groups. The IPCC team will also be coordinating a panel discussion program with Pueblo Baseball players.

The Center will host a free public reception on Friday, April 19th, prior to the Pueblo Baseball season's Mother's Day weekend opening games. The

reception will take place from 6-8PM, with members' hour from 5-6PM.

Opening - Reflective Presence: The Art of Jesse Littlebird & Jonathan Loretto New Artists Circle Gallery Exhibition Saturday, March 9 Opening Reception, Friday, March 15 | 6-8PM

This exhibition focuses on the artwork of Jesse Littlebird (Laguna/Kewa Pueblos) and Jonathan Loretto (Walatowa/Kotyiti Pueblos) and their processes of traversing home to find new views and understandings of Pueblo places and people. An artist-led project in the IPCC Artists Circle Gallery, the exhibition grounds itself in visual narratives that transport viewers through different layers of consciousness through site-specific bodies of work created by the artists.

Littlebird uses abstraction and connections to ancestral sites to tell painted, layered stories of the land on fabric and in mural-inscribed elements. Loretto creates bobblehead clay

storytellers, charcoal drawing, and black & white photography to shift viewers into reminiscent and reflective spaces of land-based narratives.

Rooted in storytelling, Littlebird and Loretto's artworks offer layered perspectives that transport viewers into new landscapes of personas, memories, and places of being. These artists locate their work in symbols, movement, narratives, and depth rooted in Pueblo understandings—all to give viewers a nuanced experience of traveling through artistic portals. An overarching theme of Pueblo stories embedded in the land nurtures the artists' relationships to home and provides an immersive visual journey for visitors.

The artists will take part in the opening reception Friday, March 15 (6-8PM) by talking about their work, inspiration and creative process at 6PM. Admission to the opening reception is free; members' hour will take place from 5-6PM.

IPCC's Family Story Time Saturdays, March 9 & 23 | 1-2PM Children's Area of Museum (No food or drinks allowed in this area.) Geared for Children Pre-K to Grade 2, but children of all ages are welcome.

On Saturday, March 9, professional Indigenous dancer Ria Thundercloud (HoChunk, Sandia) shares her debut picture book, *Finding My Dance*. In it, Ria tells the true story of her path to dance and how it helped her take pride in her Native American heritage. We'll also have a fun coloring activity.

On Saturday, March 23, our book titles will be *Coyote: A Trickster Tale from the American Southwest* by Gerald McDermott and *Coyote Places the Stars* by Harriet Peck Taylor, with Guest Storyteller Camille Romero. Make-and-take arts and crafts will once again be part of the festivities.
